DURING FIRE


Be prepared to evacuate when advised by Whatcom



Fire is a natural part of our Western Washington ecosystems.



Wildfire risk is increasing in western Washington due to environmental and human factors:

- Increasing air temperature
- Decreasing summer rain
- Earlier snowmelt
- Urban growth into forested areas

Special considerations and additional preparedness is needed for livestock owners looking to prepare for wildfires.

You can start today:

Get your gloves on:

Harden your home from embers. Clear defensible space around your home, barns and other important infrastructure.



Take a drive: Determine where you will take your animals in case of an evacuation. Find multiple routes and determine drive times to your evacuation location and to your predetermined family meeting location.



Talk to your fellow livestock owners: Ask what is their plan, can they help evacuate animals, do they have a safe space for your animals? Can you help them?



Get organized: Create a list of necessary items for preparedness kit and start packing!
